Update from Oregon State Library – Brian McGuirk	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Looking for a statistic indicator of search success to compare against the old servers.• Google added features – under review at the library and may bring to the board.• Interested in indexing Social Media for State Agencies<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Library will pilot results first.○ Using library blogs, then Twitter.• Interested in 50 State search engine for Oregon.gov<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Quality goes down with a larger search group.○ USA.gov has an actively indexed search engine – the library requested to use their indexing. Have not heard back yet.○ All governments included – does not filter state – county – city so you get them all.○ Question: What is the benefit of a 50 State search engine?○ Answer: To get answers about other States, i.e., what are other states doing about electric cars?○ Will continue looking and report back next time.• Brian reported that i-Match was in top 10 search results for the first time.
Update on TeamSite Upgrade – Michelle Brady	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Michelle reported on several “show stoppers” to the TeamSite upgrade and demonstrated one on the smart board.<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ On a SitePublisher page, in the Tiny MCE Editor, you can add a hyperlink but then you can’t hit the “OK” or done button.○ Also, in FireFox, in the VFE, you can type a sentence but when you hit “Enter” the cursor jumps back to the beginning of the line of text.<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ See attached handout for detail of more issues.○ Michelle explained that the course of action is to stay on TeamSite V6.7.2 and JVM 1.6_20 (HP to continue to support JVM 1.6_20).○ Michelle said Autonomy stated release of Patch 2 will be later this year.○ HP will evaluate “Patch 2” when released and report back.• Change Requests Update (see attached handout for details)<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ CR 16 Nav: GNB for Internet/Intranet: completed in May. Available for use.○ CR 18 Nav: Left NAV additions<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Increased number of links▪ More accurately represented the left nav preview▪ Added new checkboxes to customize appearance of left nav bar.▪ Michelle demonstrated horizontal rule and nesting on

	websites that are using the new features. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Separator lines are now just lines, not links.• Nested links show up as a 'secondary' list.
Proposed disclaimer language for ad usage on websites – Linda Morrell	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Linda explained that she had e-mailed everyone the proposed disclaimer language for ad usage on websites and asked if there were any edits needed. No one had any edits.• Question: Concern about branding with 3rd party tools, i.e. "Created by" language• Response: Lonn, Linda and Wally discussed this in their meeting and agreed that no matter where you go, you will find this kind of branding. It was decided to let that concern go and be more concerned about advertising.
Update on how states notify users they are leaving the official state webpage - Linda Morrell	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Linda stated that she checked all 50 state .gov websites and found no disclaimer upon leaving the site from the main pages.• Nicole stated that she had found one disclaimer on the New Jersey Veterans page and will forward that to Linda.• Linda reported on findings that although DAS Web pages are set to open in a new window, 68% of other state's Web pages are not. The board agreed that we stay with the current way we recommend to our users.• Kathy asked if there was a way to give a heads up when setting up the page to prompt users to set the Web page to open in a new window.• Michelle answered that it is possible and suggested Kathy submit a Change Request.
