

## Glossary of OPI Services

**Adult Day Services** means a structured comprehensive program designed to meet the needs of functionally and/or adults with cognitive impairments. Adult day service provides individually planned service, supervision, social and related support services, and health monitoring in a protective setting during any part of a day, but less than 24-hour care.

**Case management** - (determines eligibility, develops a service plan in conjunction with consumer and/or family, mobilizes other resources, authorizes and monitors services)

**Chore** - heavy housework, yard work or sidewalk maintenance)

**Escort** - Assisted transportation

**Home Delivered Meals** means a meal paid from OPI funds and delivered to an eligible individual who is receiving at least case management services.

**Home Health** means items and services furnished to an individual by a home health agency or by others under arrangement with such agency, on a visiting basis in a place of temporary or permanent

**Homecare** - housekeeping, laundry, meal preparation, med management, shopping

**Long Term Care Planning/Education** - planning for Long Term Care services as well as education for Long Term Care planning and resources.

**Personal Care** - eating; dressing/grooming; bathing/personal hygiene; ambulating/transfer; cognition/behavior; elimination [bowel and bladder management])

**Respite** - relief for family members or caregivers who are unpaid, either in or out of the home

**RN** - Services provided by a registered nurse on a short-term or intermittent basis that include but are not limited to: interviewing the individual and, when appropriate, other relevant parties; assessing the individual's ability to perform tasks; preparing a service plan that includes treatment needed by the individual; monitoring medication; training and educating providers around the provisions of the service plan.

**Service Priority Level (SPL)** - Functional impairment is defined as difficulty performing, or requiring the assistance of another person to perform, one or more of the following:

- Activities of Daily Living (ADL\*):
  - Bathing/Personal Hygiene, Cognition, Dressing/Grooming, Eating, Elimination, Mobility
- Instrumental Activities of Daily Living (IADL\*)
  - Housekeeping, Laundry, Meal Preparation, Medication Management, Shopping, Transportation.

\*ADLs are the essential elements of self-care. Inability to independently perform even one activity may indicate a need for supportive services.

\*\*IADLs are associated with independent living in the community and provide a basis for considering the type of services necessary in maintaining independence.

**The following services are classified as Other Services as approved by DHS and are not defined by administrative rule:**

- Durable Medical Equipment
- Home repair
- Legal Services
- Money Management
- Outreach
